
















# Dry Mixed Recycling – to be disposed of in clear bags only

Material	Notes
Plastic Bottles 	Must be empty, no liquids
Cardboard 	Must be clean and free of any food waste residue
Paper 	Must be clean and free of any food waste residue or liquids
Cans 	Must be empty, no liquids, no food
Magazines

Envelopes 	Padded envelopes must be disposed of as residual (general) waste

Staples 	No need to remove staples from paper. They are recyclable

# Food Waste Recycling – to be disposed of in corn starch bags only

Material	Notes	Material	Notes
<p>Plate scrapings</p> 	<p>Left over or unwanted food that has been served to customers</p>	<p>Dairy products</p> 	<p>No liquids</p>
<p>Peelings and offcuts</p> 	<p>Unusable food produced from preparing fruit, vegetables, pastries, meats, etc... No liquids</p>	<p>Fruit and vegetables</p> 	
<p>Tea bags and coffee grounds</p> 	<p>No packaging. Used tea bags and naked coffee grounds only</p>	<p>Eggs</p> 	
<p>Meat and fish</p> 	<p>Cooked or uncooked including bones</p>	<p>Bread and cakes</p> 	
<p>Food with primary packaging</p> 	<p>Food in a single layer of packaging. No empty packaging allowed</p>	<p>Pasta and rice</p> 	


# Residual (General) Waste

Material	Notes
Soiled food packaging 	Packaging contaminated with any food or liquid residues
Crisp Packets 	Any and all crisp packets
Sweet Wrappers 	Any wrapping that has contained sweets, including chocolate
Cardboard Coffee Cups 	Cardboard coffee cups are not recyclable due to the wax covering on the inside of the cup
Crockery 	Crockery from breakages is not recyclable
Gloves 	Plastic or rubber gloves
Composite packaging 	Foil backed card, card with bubble wrap attached, card with padding, etc...

Material	Notes
CD's or DVD's 	
Hard Plastic 	Rigid plastics
Green Waste 	Bouquets of flowers, plants, etc...
Small pieces of wood 	Small wood items only. Large amounts would require a separate collection
Polystyrene 	Any and all polystyrene packaging including cups
Textiles 	
Mirrors 	
Napkins and hand towels 	Soiled napkins/hand wipes

# Glass Waste Recycling

Material	Notes
Glass bottles 	Must be empty, no liquids. Any colour glass is acceptable

Glass Jars 	Must be empty, no liquids or food residue. Any colour glass is acceptable
